2023 Annual Security Report

The Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) is committed to providing the safest environment possible for work and study. Part of that commitment involves providing information about campus safety and security, crime statistics, and resources to current and prospective students as well as employees. MUSC is pleased to announce that its <u>2023 Annual Security Report</u> (ASR) is now available.

The ASR contains various policy statements for the University and includes statistics for the previous three years (2020, 2021, and 2022) related to certain crimes that occurred on campus, in or on certain MUSC owned off-campus property, and on public property accessible from the main campus. The policy statements reflect MUSC's current campus safety and security procedures and practices related to MUSC's response to crimes and emergencies, issuance of emergency notifications and timely warnings, security of and access to campus facilities, security considerations used in the maintenance of campus facilities, how the University responds to reported incidents of sexual misconduct and interpersonal violence, and other matters of importance related to security and safety on campus.

The report also provides information on topics such as the authority of campus law enforcement officials, crime reporting policies, the role of designated campus security authorities (or CSAs), the <u>Daily Crime Log</u>, MUSC's alcohol and other drugs (AOD) policies and programs, overview of security awareness and crime prevention programs, educational programs and campaigns to promote the awareness of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking, and disciplinary procedures for University students and employees, to name just a few.
